Apply Early!

Auburn University would like to serve every qualified student who applies; however, due to the competitive process and space limitations, you are encouraged to apply as soon as your high school transcript (complete through the junior year) is available. Auburn will begin processing Fall 2005 applications on June 1, 2004. Transfer applicants are encouraged to apply by January 1, 2005 for Fall 2005 admission.

Please Note: Admission to Auburn constitutes acceptance to the University. Some academic areas require a second application process (after completion of the core curriculum requirements) in order to move from the “pre” curricular classes into the formal academic program. - Please note the following definitions:

Freshmen: Students who are currently attending or who have graduated from high school. In addition to the requested credentials listed on the application cover, students must submit a final transcript after graduation.

Early Decision Freshmen: A student who applies “Early Decision” agrees that Auburn University is the institution that he or she has chosen to attend if accepted. The student will not submit additional “Early Decision” applications to other colleges or universities. Freshmen who choose “Early Decision” must apply by Nov. 1 and submit the required \$200 deposit for admission by Dec. 1 of their senior year. **Early Decision deposits ARE NOT REFUNDABLE.**

Transfer: Students who apply as transfers have attended another college or university after graduating from high school. Applicants must have a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average on all college work attempted and complete at least one accredited class in math, English, history, and science. Some majors have higher requirements for transfer. Please consult <http://www.auburn.edu/admissions> and select the “AU Bulletin” button for the current requirements.

Auditor: Students who attend classes for no academic credit.

Visiting Student (Transient): Visiting students who wish to transfer Auburn academic credit to their primary college or university.

Joint Enrollment: Students who are seeking joint (simultaneous) enrollment in Auburn University and their high school. Such students will have completed their junior year in high school and wish to take college courses. Permission is needed from the high school principal or counselor and a parent/guardian.

Early Admission: Students who wish to forego part of their high school curriculum and apply for admission to the university with the permission of their high school principal or counselor and a parent/guardian. For Early Admission requirements please call the Admissions Office at 334-844-4080.

Unclassified: Students who are taking classes as prerequisites for another program or students who have completed their bachelor’s degree and are taking post-Baccalaureate non-degree courses. Students must submit a copy of their college diploma or proof of their undergraduate degree.

Be on the lookout for:

- **Housing application:** Housing information will be sent to all accepted freshmen following submission of the \$200 admission deposit. Housing space is limited so if you are interested in living on-campus, we encourage you to apply as soon as possible.
- **Financial Aid information** will be sent to you following your completed admission to the University. We recommend that you fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/> as soon as your family receives all of their tax information. The financial aid priority deadline is March 1st. In order for the Federal Processor to process your FAFSA by the priority deadline, it is advisable that you apply online no later than three weeks prior to the priority deadline. Awarding of financial aid will begin at this time; however, the University will continue to award financial aid after this date.
- **The Freshman Scholarship deadline is December 1st** of your senior year. All application materials must be postmarked by this date in order to receive consideration for general freshman academic scholarships. Some departmental scholarships carry a later deadline.

Additional Freshman Application Information

Your application is very important to us and for that reason we ask that you mail it as early as possible during your senior year. To ensure you receive full consideration, be sure to apply no later than fall semester of your senior year. Once we have received your application, you will hear from us concerning your admission decision and receive important information from Auburn every few weeks. If you have any questions during the application process, please contact the Admissions Office at admissions@auburn.edu or 1-800-AUBURN9.

When and how may I apply?

Students wishing to enter Auburn as a freshman in the summer or fall of 2005 may apply to Auburn as early as June 1, 2004. **Students should apply as soon as their high school transcript (complete through the junior year) is available.** An application consists of a completed and signed application form, a \$25 application fee, your high school transcript, and either your ACT or your SAT test score. We encourage you to submit your application online at: <http://auburn.edu/admissions> for the fastest response.

How will Auburn make the admission decision?

Each student must complete the following core curriculum requirements by the end of his or her senior year of high school.

- 4 years English
- 3 years social studies
- 3 years math including Algebra I and II, and either Geometry, Trigonometry, Calculus, or Analysis
- 2 years science including Biology and Physical Sciences with Laboratory Component

In addition to an evaluation of core classes, Auburn will consider your high school grade point average (GPA), ACT and/or SAT scores, and the additional information supplied on the back of the application.

Who should apply?

Anyone interested in Auburn University should apply. Auburn is committed to enrolling the best prepared students into its programs and will consider all applications that are received.

When will you hear from us?

Once your application file is complete, including receipt of your application, your transcript(s), your application fee, and your ACT and/or SAT scores, you should hear from the University in approximately one week (holidays excluded).

Do I have to make a deposit to hold my space in class?

Yes. After you have been accepted, we must receive your admission deposit before we can reserve your place in class. In addition to holding your space in class, all accepted students, including scholarship students, must submit the admission deposit in order to receive information about university housing or to register for the summer orientation program, Camp War Eagle.
